### ***Camp Wide Game: Scout Trivia***

Upon check-in, patrols will be given a work sheet with questions ranging from Baden Powell to Justin Ryan. Answer as many questions as possible. Someone in camp will know the answer (so visit other campsites, check-in stations, etc...) Turn-in the answer sheet at the Shelter Building on Saturday.

***First Aid:*** Render First Aid to an injured person using knowledge from Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class.

***Equipment needed:*** First Aid kit, one blanket, BSA Handbook – page 291

***Travos Race:*** (A trestle): Using proper knots and lashings, build a Travos and transport one patrol member through the course.

***Equipment needed:*** 8 lashing ropes, poles will be provided by Camporee, BSA Handbook – page 140

***Height, Width and Distance:*** Know how to measure height and width of objects. Determine the distance between two points. Using one or more of the Scout methods.

***Equipment needed:*** BSA handbook – page 118-125, First Class requirement

***Trailing and Tracking:*** Patrols will be asked to identify trail signs used by early Scouts to mark trails. They will also identify animal tracks that they may encounter.

***Equipment needed:*** See Study Guide.

***Flag History:*** Be able to identify different flags from the U.S. History and answer questions about the U.S. Flag.

***Equipment needed:*** Study Guide and BSA handbook – page 42-44

***Shelter and Hot Meal:*** During the lunch period, each patrol will build a shelter from natural materials found in the area. (Cutting Honey Suckle to build shelters is OKAY!) Any items from the list of equipment may also be used. Patrols will also be required to cook a hot meal over an open campfire. Using safe fire methods and safe wood tool skills. Meals must include a meat (beef, pork or chicken), two vegetables and a hot beverage (cocoa, tea or cider). May be a tin foil dinner, which is prepared ahead of time. Campsites cleaned up with LEAVE NO TRACE policies.

***Equipment needed:*** BSA Handbook – page 224-225

***String Burning:*** Patrols will have up to 10 minutes to set-up their fire, using only NATURAL materials (no processed woods or other materials). Material may be brought from home. Patrols with First Class and under Scouts will be given two matches to light the fire. Patrols with Star and above will light fire with other means. (Flint and steel, fire by friction, magnifying glass, etc...) NO LIGHTERS.

***Equipment needed:*** BSA Handbook – page 249-252

***Knots:*** Each patrol member needs to know how to tie the following knots:  
Square Knot, Clove Hitch, Bowline, Two-Half Hitches, Tautline, Timber Hitch, Sheep Bend and Sheep Shank.

*Equipment needed:* 8 ropes for tying, which will be provided by Patrol

***Match Striking:*** Patrol members will take turns trying to light matches using the blade end of a hand axe. Safe handling of the axe at all times.

*Equipment needed:* BSA Handbook – page 81. Patrol supplies the hand axe.

***Evening Dinner, One Pot Cooking:*** Patrols will be asked to cook a healthy meal for the evening dinner. Meal must include: Meat, starch, vegetables, dessert and a hot drink. Suggestions: Stew, Chili, Sausage beans and Rice. Desserts: Apples, Pears and Bananas.

*Equipment needed:* Using only one large pot, Dutch oven, coffee pot, aluminum foil and utensils for the dinner.
